BCM TRAINING Update



Two of our UK Lead Trainers, Barbara and Angeline, had a fun weekend in June, at Great Parks Chapel in Paignton, training 14 children's ministry volunteers. There were some interesting questions, lots of laughter and encouraging conversations at this *In Step with the Master Teacher* workshop.

Over a Friday evening and all day Saturday they thought about God's attitude towards children; being good models for children of what it means to know, love and obey God; how to build good relationships; how to use each aspect of a programme to help disciple children; how to communicate the Bible effectively; how to present the gospel in a way children can understand; as well as thinking about teaching Bible memory verses, helping children grow in their faith and creatively involving all the senses when teaching the Bible.

In one session Barb showed the trainees some small knitted



people which are good tools for telling stories to younger children. She left a pattern with the church and one lady, Beryl, is now making some to use in their children's work. It shows that you don't have to be a teacher to be part of a children's ministry team. Everyone's talents can be put to good use.

Gemma, the children's/youth ministry co-ordinator, said: *"The team enjoyed the training - it was practical, interactive, informative*

and fun! The training gave them more confidence and encouraged them to continue in the great work they're doing. (And they were all really pleased with their certificates!)"

BCM Anchor Trust Updates

Here is the feedback I have had to date on the BCM Objectives for the LINK UP.

Objective 1

Upgrade the BCM Websites: (Pilot - David White)

The fresh new look BCM UK's website at www.bcm.org.uk has now been up and running for several months. News updates are added on a weekly basis and there are areas devoted to camps, training and the work around the UK as well as a diary page that can be used in conjunction with our downloadable magazine for prayer supporters. The most recent development of the BCM UK website is the inclusion of an on-line web-store selling all of the Footsteps of Faith Resource and Visual CDs.

The BCM UK website contains a secure section for BCM workers and volunteers that contains policy documents, handbooks and forms with which all workers should be familiar. If workers would like other resources added or need access they should email the webmaster at web.admin@bcm.org.uk

Objective 2

Develop BCM UK Management Structure: (Pilot - Tom Morrow)

The Anchor Trust have been examining various structures that could help in improving the governance and management of BCM UK. We are hoping to be able to present the options at the UK Conference in October.

Objective 3

To make BCM better known (Pilot - David White)

It is planned over the summer to supply supporters with promotional material to pass on to those involved with BCM in the past or to those who may be interested in supporting the work now and in the future. We are aiming to increase our prayer and support base.

Objective 4

Develop and train our young people in their ministry (Pilots - Richard Thompson/Stan Paget)

Plans will be presented at the UK Conference in October.

Objective 5

Extend ISMT in UK/Ireland: (Pilot - Dorothy Armstrong)

Discussions are planned to take place with the ISMT Lead Trainers.

Objective 6

Market survey of current BCM Teaching Materials: (Pilot - Tom Morrow)

A return rate of 78% was achieved from the 23 Missionaries and Anchor Trustees who received the survey questionnaire sent out in July. The Anchor Trust will be analysing the responses and will present the conclusions and recommendations at the UK Conference in October. The survey shows that two-thirds of those surveyed use BCM Teaching Material in some way and positive suggestions have been received on how to improve FootSteps of Faith so that we can make it more widely available.



BCM Seminar

Funding the Family Business

19 participants attended the two day "Funding the Family Business Seminar" with Myles Wilson at Mullartown in May. Here are some of the positive comments received as feedback from the BCM UK and BCM ROI missionaries who participated.

"Great that BCM is openly addressing the issue of raising/keeping support. Thanks to the Anchor Trust for organising the seminar"

"It was great that we begun by looking at the Bible"

"The concept of each worker having a strong partnership/support team around them is necessary for the whole concept to work and one that should be encouraged"

"I found the seminar to be quite interesting. I had never put much thought into committed prayer and emotional support (outside of my family and friends) and it was good for me to hear

this. It has definitely helped to see how my fundraising should look"

"The course challenged me about communicating better with my support team and I have written to my prayer and financial supporters and have received some e-mails back thanking me for the encouragement including some people I don't hear from very often"

"I feel that the seminar has helped me gain confidence in asking if people would like to support me! But the biggest thing I really got out of it is to see your supporters as your team, and that team needs to be regularly informed and kept up to date - they need to feel part of this journey!"

"We are only starting out on this missionary journey and need as much help and training as we can get. It's also good having topic training, as then we have the time to put this stuff into place!"

"I wouldn't be able to ask people directly for financial support as recommended"

"One major positive is that it changed my perspective on fundraising from 'It's a necessary evil' to 'This is an incredible opportunity to partner with people.'

Not everyone could agree with all aspects of Myle's

approach to support raising, but it has provided us with a useful springboard to get us talking about how to develop a more effective strategy that will be able to help move new and experienced missionaries from "faith" to "being faithfully supported". It has been encouraging to hear that some of the teaching at the seminar are being put into practice and exciting when one new contact thanked the missionary for getting in touch and giving them the privilege of being a supporter

.The seminar has taught us that it's not just about finding financial supporters - it's about building teams of givers and receivers who are working together in partnership in the Gospel to extend God's Kingdom with God who is the Ultimate Giver:
