As I write this, I am finishing a visit to Holland. Yesterday for children (and adults) it was Pakjesavond, Saint Nicholas' Eve. Christmas Season has now officially begun. Whatever your Christmas traditions may be, this beginning of the Christmas season was new for me, and quickly became something extra special as I learned about it through the eyes of the school children. Students exchange names in class, and each child prepares a gift for the friend whose name they drew. A gift is selected by thinking about their friend's interests and likings,

and finding something that reflects what their friend values and likes. The child then prepares a gift-covering that reflects the gift's content. It could take any shape, it maybe that of ball for someone sport minded, a favorite flower painted on a box, or a simple paper bag coloured and decorated to complement the gift inside. The wrapping of the gift reflects both the content and also the special intent of the giver.

Pakjesavond reminds me of the greatest of all gives that we celebrate during this Christmas Season. God so loved us, that he carefully chose a gift for us, a special gift that only he could

give, and wrapped it "just so" in the form of a newborn baby. But that "special wrapping" also reflected the intent of the Giver who was giving us a gift of immeasurable worth--- our Wonderful Counselor, our Mighty God, our Everlasting Father, our Prince of Peace.
