Quizzes When we talk to children about the Bible, they may not always understand, or remember, what we say. Even if we have thought carefully about the words we've used and explained things in ways we think they will understand, it's always good to double check what they are taking away from your time together. A fun way of doing this is with a quiz and here's a suggested way of scoring.



Practical Tip

Come up with questions based on the Bible passage you've been learning about. Divide them into easy, medium, and hard questions. Write each question on an individual piece of card. Include questions about applying the Bible teaching as well as factual answers.

Decorate three boxes with the numbers 1, 2, and 3. Put the easy questions in box no.1; the medium questions in box no.2; and the hard questions in box no.3. Divide the children into teams. Each team can pick which box they want to answer a question from. If they choose a question from no.1, they get 1 point if they answer it correctly; if they choose a question from no.2, they get 2 points; and from no.3, they get 3 points. When a child gets the answer right, always repeat the answer to make sure that everyone has heard it.

Most children love quizzes and they are a fun way of checking how much the children have heard and understood. They can give you an opportunity to correct any misunderstandings and let you know how much you need to re-cap in your next session.
